From President Anne Peron:

Dearest congregation,

It is canvass time again. I have to confess...money is absolutely my least favorite topic of conversation. I think maybe it stems from my life before UUship. I remember Sunday after Sunday of listening to the "Father" (pastor) speak of how much we should give and how guilty we should feel if we don't. Will "Satan come beggin' at my door?" I have never been a believer in Satan. Actually, looking back, I think I was born an earth centered UU. It was such an incredible turn off for me that I still cringe at the thought of talking about money as we speak of it. In the past I have pledged "time". February Board Briefs:

Gratitude – Thank you to: Toby Haber-Giasson and Anne Kinney for organizing the All-Church Birthday Party; Jim Chaplin for stepping up as Canvass Chair; Bob Thorpe for finding chairs for the chapel; Mary Kay Weisenberger for organizing Jodi’s Sabbatical Farewell on 2-20-11; Sara Karam for her work at the Chili Cook-off; Diane and Jim Chaplin for assisting with the purchase of the replacement kitchen stove; and Bob Thorpe for the remainder of the stove purchase and his installation of additional vestry outlets. Our deep appreciation!

Refining and defining how we work together – We are finding that today’s email technology enhances our ability to communicate between meetings, but it also presents complexities for the board to consider! Anne Kinney searched for email voting policies developed by other UU churches but none surfaced. She found that as a non-profit organization, Auburn UU can be guided by state law governing non-profit entities. Although Maine law does not specifically reference email voting, it does make provision for boards to take action without meeting in person. We will continue to study the issue and have a task force develop an Email Decision-Making Policy that will detail when email decisions are appropriate, how issues are presented, and the process for entering decisions into written records. Outside of this, we will try to be mindful of levels of importance or urgency when issues come to us and clarify responsibility, while making sure people are heard.

The Board has begun to hold two meetings a month. We are also educating ourselves about “Consent Agendas” which can be incorporated into regular Board agendas as a way of approving routine items such as minutes and reports, and thus streamlining the meeting process.

Hiring a Sexton – The Finance Committee has requested that we hire a Sexton - with the expectation that his/her salary would come primarily from rental fees. We will develop a job description, a tentative contract form, and check with members and friends about their interest in such a position before we advertise outside the church.

Other Business - Several board positions will be open for new candidates at the June Annual Meeting, as will a few committee chair positions. Robin Smutny is making sure we have up-to-date descriptions to pass along to the Nominating Committee so they can begin their work.

If you have any questions regarding the content of the report, feel free to contact a Board member. Please note that Board meetings are open to all, and as a general rule are held on the second and fourth Mondays of each month unless it’s a holiday. Our next meetings are Monday, March 14th and Monday, March 28th, both at 6:30 p.m.

Building and Grounds Report

When one of the three electric ranges in our kitchen developed problems, not worth repairing, we met with several church members who customarily use the kitchen to review kitchen uses and needs based on our current activities and projected future programs. The following issues came to light.

1. Three ovens are important for large meals such as the planned dinner on March 5.
2. More counter space is needed for preparing meals.
3. More electric outlets were requested for slow cookers and microwaves, etc.
4. Replace the old worn out food disposer and sink with new unit and dress up the dirty-dish return.

We have been chipping away at this list and are pleased to report:

- a) We found a good used electric range with a 1 year warranty that now fits nicely with the other two ranges.
- b) Kitchen counter space has been found by storing the coffee urns in cabinets below the kitchen counter and setting up a table in the vestry with three new electric outlets, each on a separate circuit, for Sunday morning Coffee Hour and other functions. The three electric outlets can also serve 6 slow cookers for our Chili Cook Off, etc.
- c) More electrical work is planned to upgrade the outlets above the kitchen counters.
- d) A proposal has been developed to provide for a new food disposer and sink to upgrade the pre-rinse area. This will be discussed as the new FY 2011-12 budget is prepared.

Purim Service March 20

Sunday, March 20th, Worship Associates Ari Rosenberg and Charles Nero will be leading a service focused on the Jewish holiday Purim. For those of you who are less familiar with the holiday--Purim is the celebration of when Queen Esther saved the Jews from Haman, a minister to the King of the Persian empire. Traditionally Jews celebrate the holiday by dressing up as characters from the story, actively engaging in the story of Esther when it is read, imbibing, and eating hamantaschen (a Jewish pastry). Wisdom literature suggests that the focus on imbibing strong drink and eating is to encourage celebrants to blur the boundaries created by social categories, as is the case with Queen Esther. She was Jewish, yet her marriage to a gentile (non-Jewish) king placed her in a unique position to save her people from destruction. Charles and Ari invite everyone in the congregation to dress with the theme of "blurring boundaries" in mind for our own congregational celebration of Purim. We encourage you to think imaginatively about the boundaries that contain and constrain us, and how blurring them might pose creative solutions for our liberation.

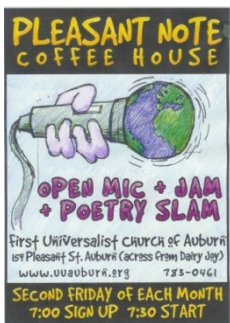
OPEN MIC

**"TOM FOOLERY": LIGHTER TOUCH & SERIOUS ISSUES
AT NNED ANNUAL MEETING APRIL 1-2**

What else could be the theme for an April Fool's weekend gathering of the congregations in our Northern New England District (NNED)?! The occasion is the *Spring Conference and Annual Meeting of the NNED*. It will take place Friday April 1st and Saturday April 2nd at the Red Jacket Inn, North Conway, N.H.

We expect to have a number of representatives attending from our church including Maryat Lessard, Anne Kinney, Anne Perron, Bonnie Soper, and Christine Babb. Others interested are encouraged to join us. (Riding a unicycle or wearing a fool's hat is an asset at this conference!)

The event begins Friday evening with a banner parade where our own church banner will be displayed, to be followed by a multigenerational celebration of April Fool's Day.

The Saturday morning keynote address, "*The Heart Needs Courage*," will be given by Rev. Tom Chulak, longtime UU parish minister (and brother of our District Executive, Rev. Mary Higgins). He is described as a funny and lively presenter. He'll lead us in the examination of such questions as, "*What keeps us from being more bold? What keeps us from acting on our convictions? What keeps us from being more courageous?*" And "*what is it going to take to break down some of the barriers between adults and youth? We will explore the courage it takes to cross boundaries and open up.*"

In addition to music, worship, and exhibits, Saturday's schedule includes district business and presentation of District Awards. There will also be breakout sessions on a variety of topics:

1. **The Heart Needs Courage, Continuing Conversation**, Rev. Thomas Chulak and Rev. Mary Higgins.
2. **Building Courage and Hope Towards Environmentally Sustainable Community**, NNED Environmental Sustainability Task Force.
3. **Small Group Ministry for All Ages: UU Humor**, NNED Small Group Ministry Committee.
4. **Building Community Through Music in Worship**, Sarah Dan Jones, President of the Unitarian Universalist Musicians Network.
5. **Congregationally Based Justice Work**, Rev. Karen Brammer, NNED, with presentations by congregations engaged in this work.
6. **A Taste of Harvest (the Power)**, Angela Matthews, Plymouth, NH, and George Anderson, Tamworth, NH. - hands on training in lay leadership.

Interested members and friends will find more information about the conference posted on our church bulletin board in the hallway. Early bird registration deadline is March 11th, with a final registration deadline – with higher rates - of March 23rd (walk-ins are not allowed).
